



## About the project

Europe's future lies in young peoples' hands and young people and their employability, their job creation potential and entrepreneurship skills have to have the priority across all other priorities.

Our aim is to motivate and guide young people by spreading the culture of work and make them work together comparing best practices in order to explore some of the most significant rules concerning job regulations and safety. It is important to know regulations that vary depending on the student's home country and the destined country. EU students have the same right to work in their own home country as well as abroad.

The focus will be on the exchange of good practices in order to study the realities in some European countries in order to ensure that those who will find themselves operating in an increasingly competitive European market will be offered an education that provides the opportunity to experience contact with both the local job market and others European countries. A particular focus will be on workplace safety and on the identification of procedures for the implementation of security measures.

# Aims

Thanks to the work of cooperation and exchange of “good practices” from each country we aim at contributing at making our students

- better understand the characteristics of labour market in some European countries and the opportunities for young people;
- analyze the reasons of youth unemployment that create big inequalities among the different regions ;
- compare their working experiences and internships;
- know the rules about safety at work to disseminate knowledge in the field of safety and health at work places and to compare the data about the job employment in Europe for young people,
- acquire the knowledge, skills and competences to enter and prosper in the world of work;
- understand that working in another country can make it easier to find a job after your studies.

The project will also offer the students a chance to improve language skills, gain self-confidence and independence and immerse themselves in a new culture.

We aim at empowering young generation to realize their potential, make use of European citizenship to its full extent and start shaping their dream career of tomorrow.

## Work process

Our schools are situated in the South of Europe but we will develop an eTwinning community with countries in the North of Europe where working places and regulations have different characteristics in order to compare experiences.

As the decision-makers of tomorrow we need to empower our young students to make the right choices using an engaging approach. The activities will aim to generate greater interest in the world of work in our societies by encouraging interaction and exchanging good practices between our countries and their Etwinning partners.

As a starting point we will have a questionnaire to have a global picture of the needs related to the work experience schemes and see how teachers and students consider the possibility of getting to know the methods of "Work based learning" in other European countries as an important factor. This could favour their integration into the working world both in Italy and in Europe.

Students will compare the characteristics of "Work based learning" and internships in their countries. They will have to prepare a report on their working experiences pointing out the positive and negative aspects then in mixed groups they will analyze the differences pointing out the best practices


An Internship allows students to

- to know perfectly (or almost) a foreign language




# Survey on working students' experiences



**January 21, 2022** - Lorenzo Parelli, 18, died in an accident at a company in Lauzacco, in the province of Udine. The boy was participating in a PTCO project in a mechanical company. While metal carpentry work was in progress at the company, a beam fell on the 18-year-old and killed him. Lorenzo was attending the fourth year in the field of industrial mechanics at the vocational training center of the Bearzi Salesian Institute in Udine. It was his last day of training!!!

**February 14, 2022** Giuseppe Lenoci, 16, died during an internship in a thermo-hydraulic company in Fermano. The student was on board a company van when suddenly the van, in which the 16-year-old was to go for an experience and replace a boiler, skidded and ended up against a tree




**17th September 2022** **Giuliano De Seta**, 17 September 2022 Giuliano De Seta, 18, died working in a Venetian company specializing in metal bending in Noventa di Piave, in the province of Venice, overwhelmed by a heavy iron plate, which slipped from a tripod and hit in full the boy in the lower limbs.


## Country


## Age


## Position


## Internship lenght


Did you feel safe at your workplace?


Did you have the necessary knowledge to handle an emergency situation?






